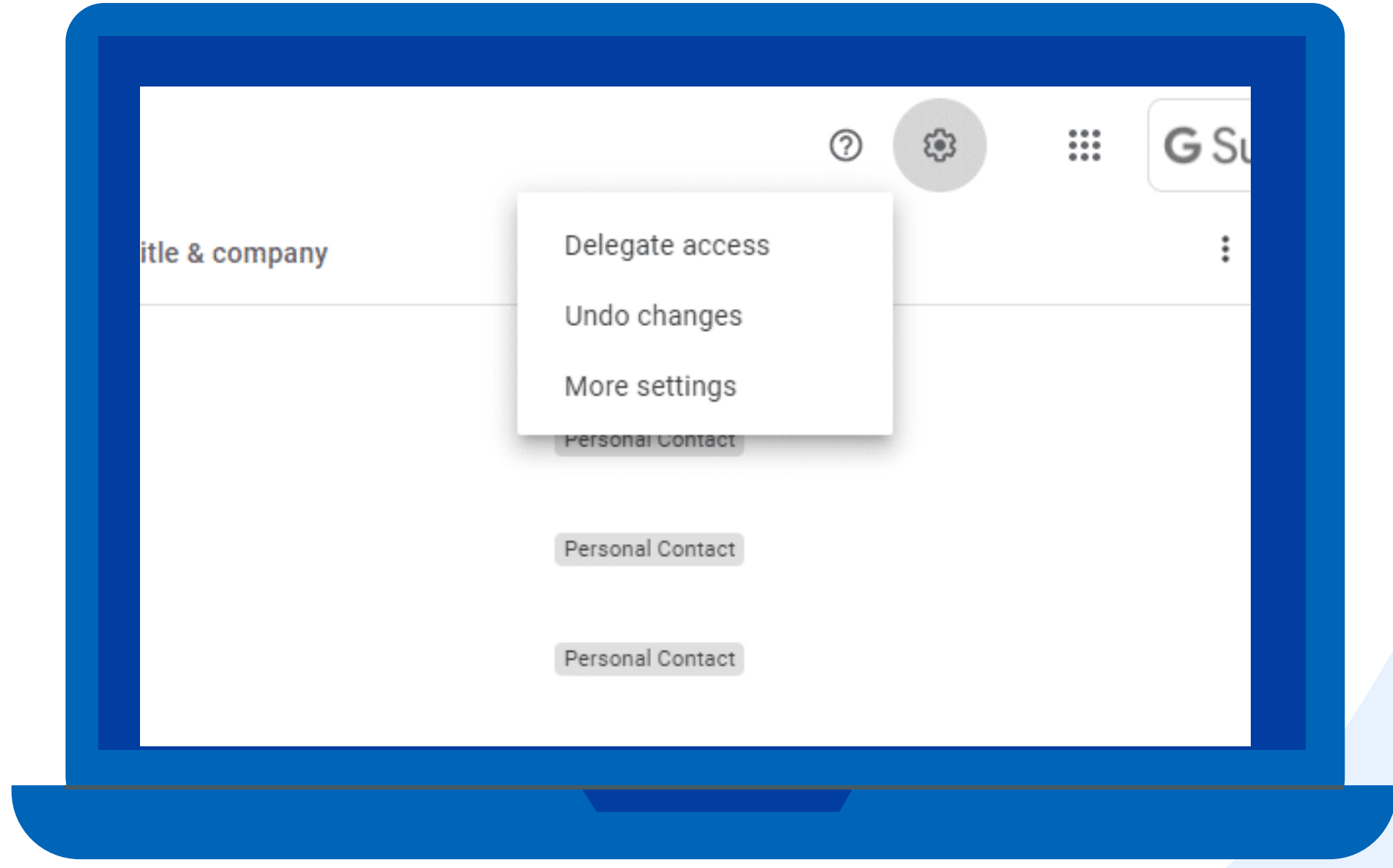
What happens if for some reason you lose a contact or they are accidentally deleted due to a faulty application? It can be quite traumatic, to say the least. Don't worry we got you covered!

How to restore contacts from Google Contacts web interface

STEP 1

Google Contacts – Settings

Hidden away within the Google contacts web interface <https://contacts.google.com> is a neat undo changes option.

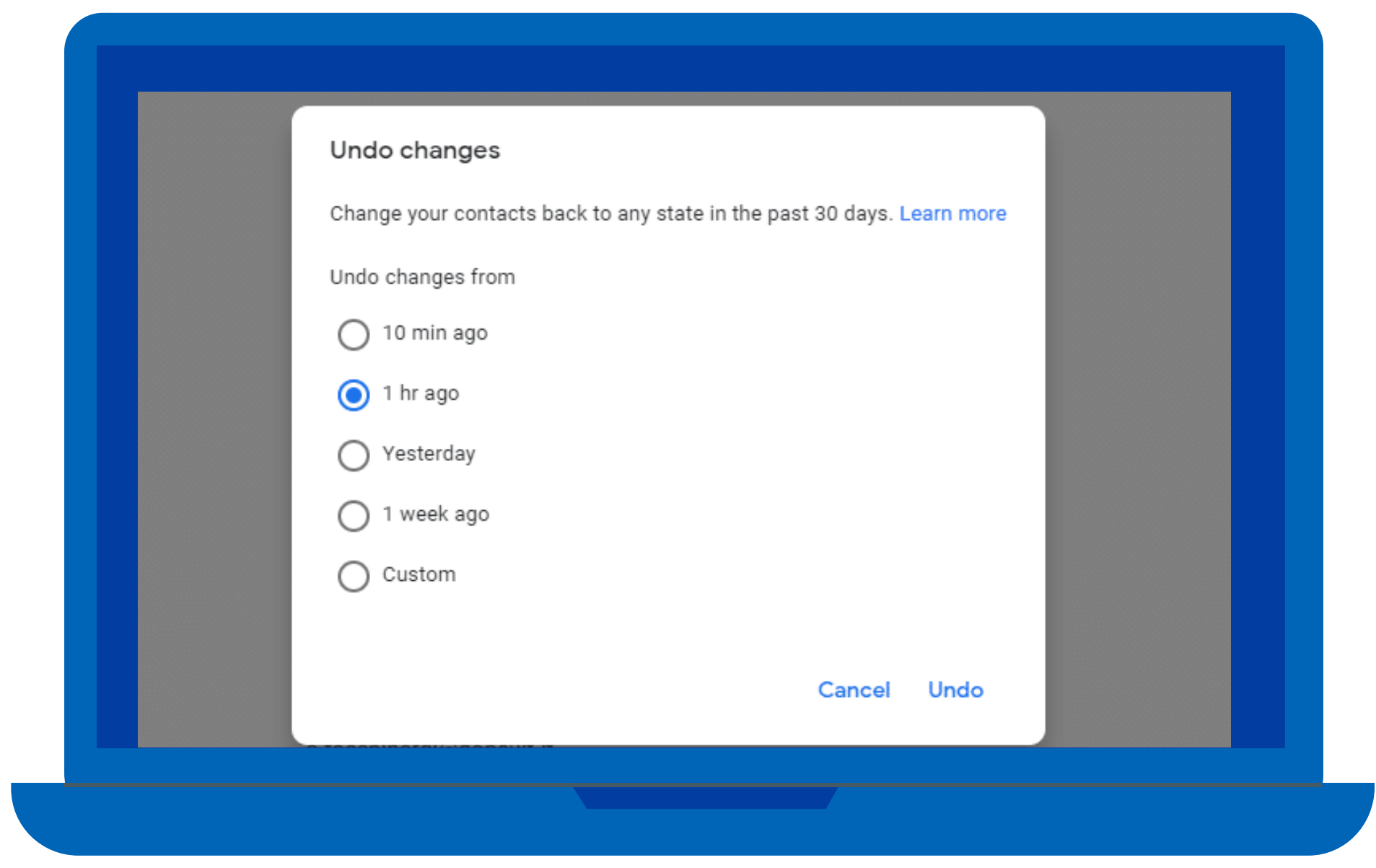


STEP 2

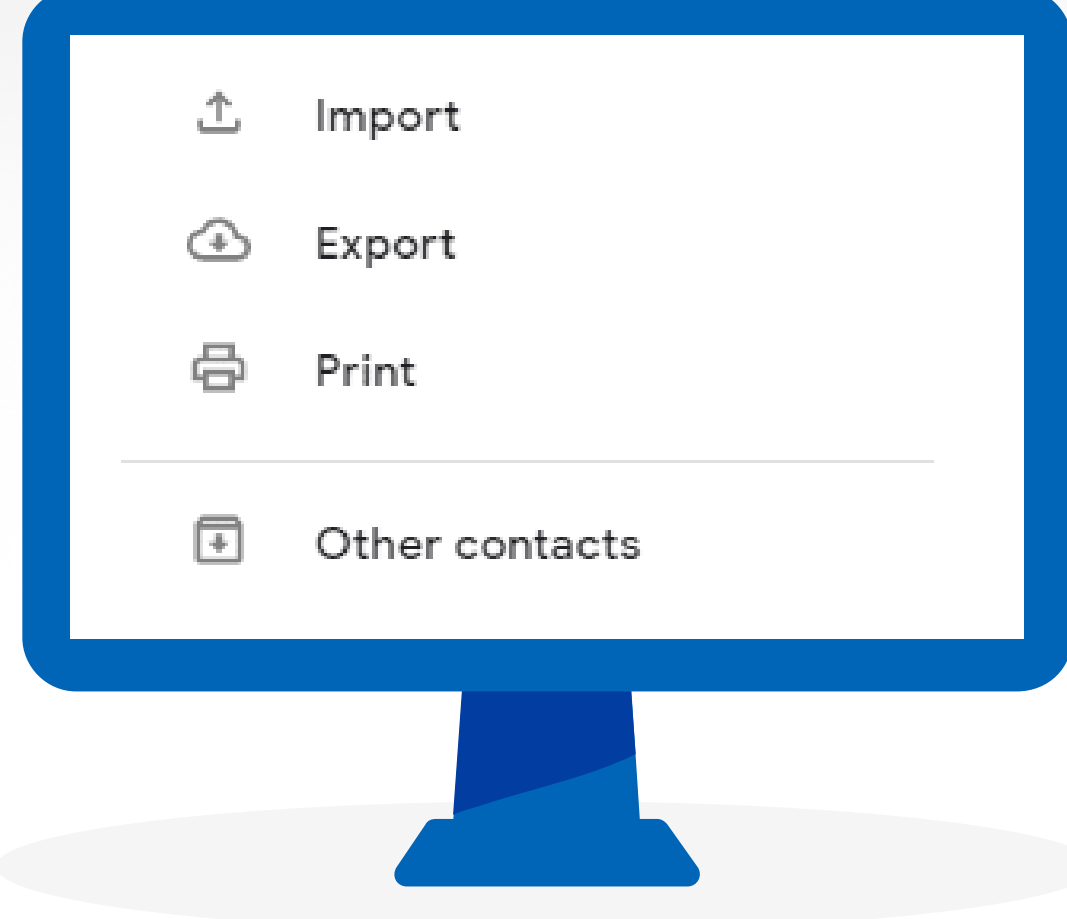
Undo changes – Google Contacts

To restore your Google contacts, you just need to click on the **cog icon** and select “Undo changes”. Once you select this the following dialogue box will appear.

From here you will be able to put your contacts back to how they were and bring back the contacts you deleted or lost.



NOTE : If you’ve recently added new Google contacts these will be removed. So if you’ve added a lot of contacts you Export all your contacts just in case.



How to restore contacts from a backup on your phone



You can restore your Google contacts via the contact backups on your Android device.



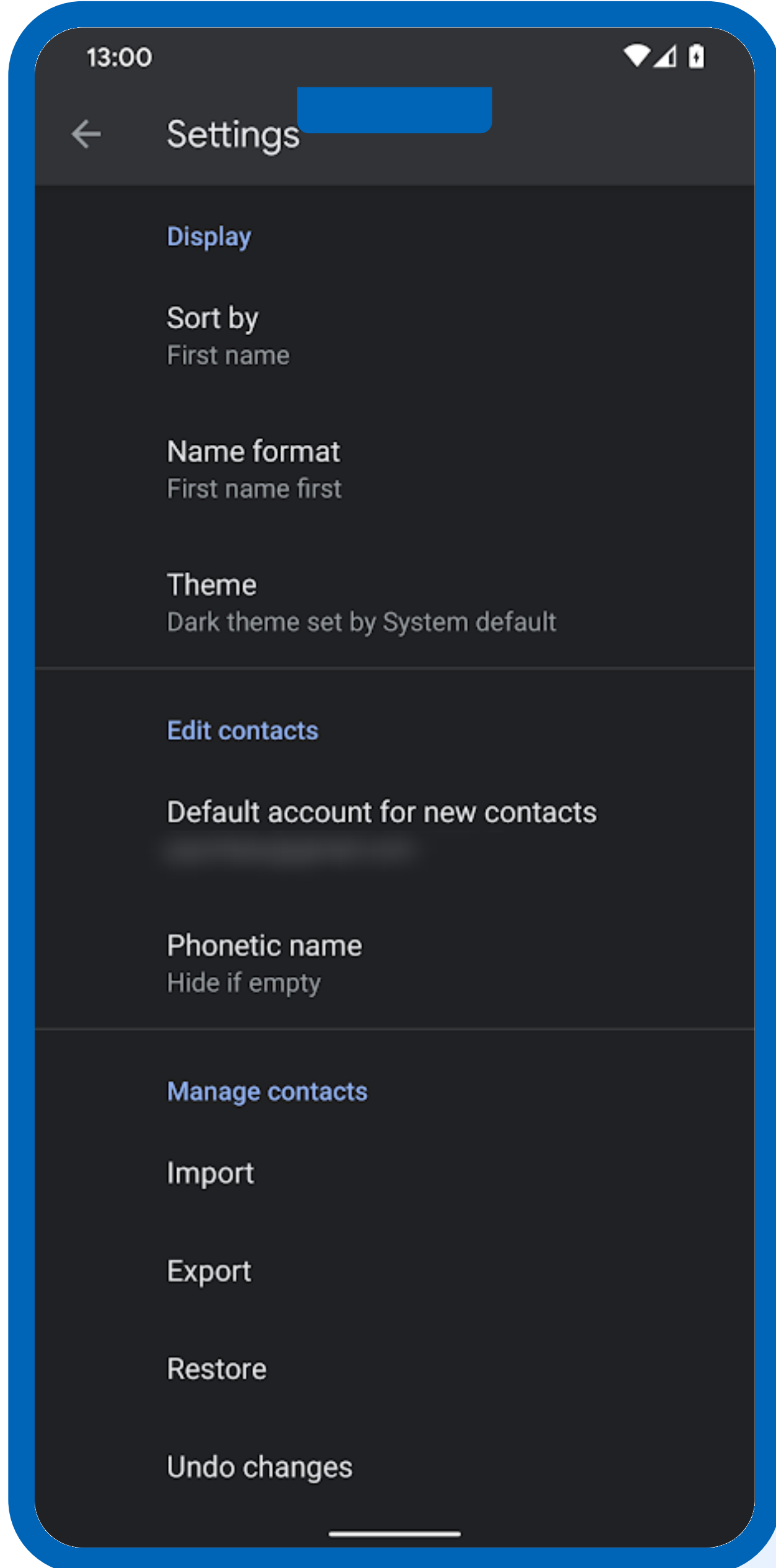
STEP 1

You can restore your Google contacts via the contact backups on your Android device.

Google Contact App – Settings

- access the “**Settings**” menu from within the Google Contacts App.

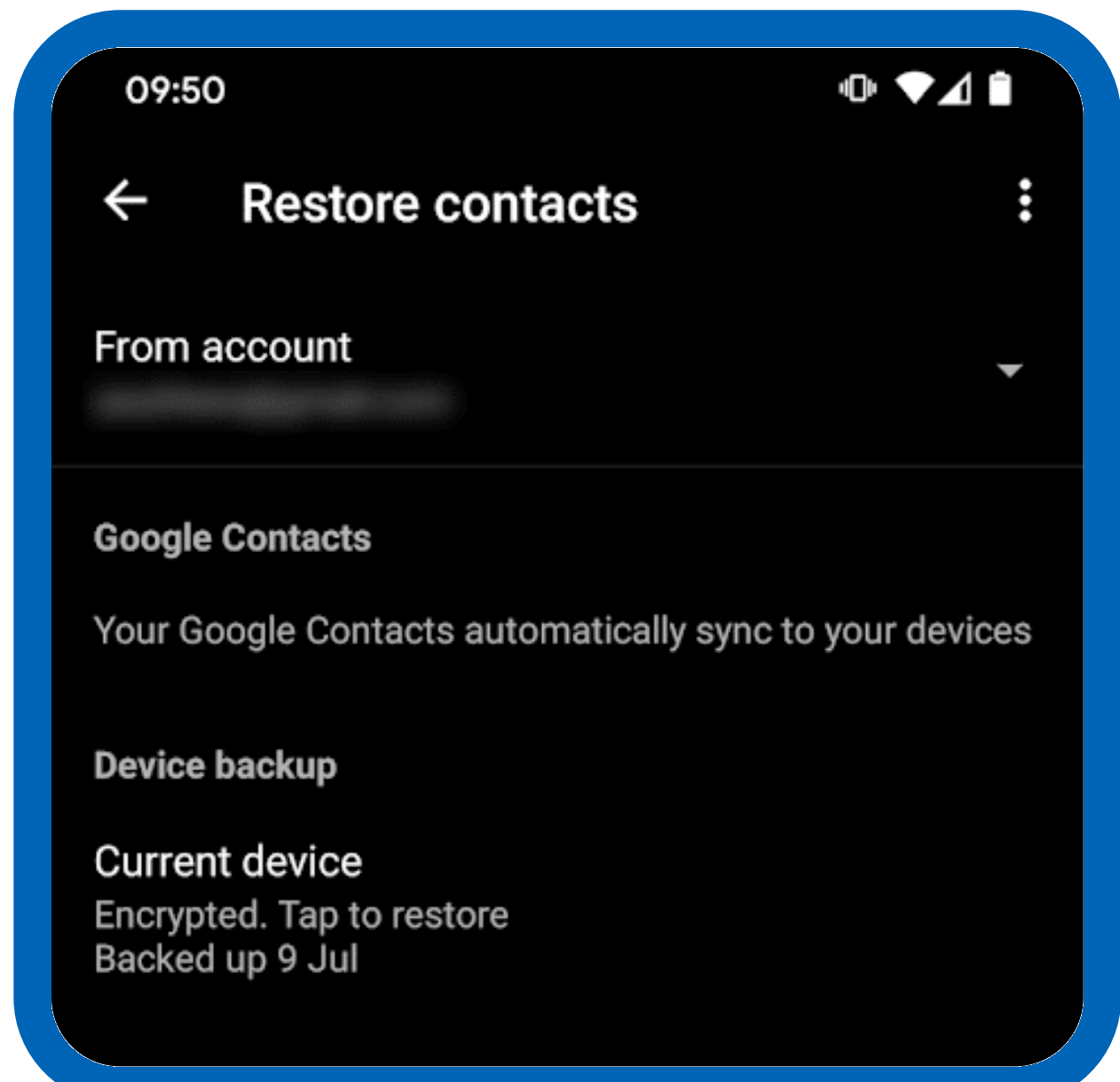
-From here you have a few options, “**Restore**” Or “**Undo changes**”



STEP 2

Google Contact Restore options

To restore contacts from a backup you’re going to have to select “**Restore**”.It will restore all the contacts from a previous Android backup.



NOTE : Again, if any contacts have been added since the last backup they will be removed when you perform your restore, so take an export so you keep all your current contacts.
